


Journey To My Roots



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September Unit: Butterflies, Prophet Musa and Muharram

Unit study at a preschool and kindergarten level comprises of 3 components:

- 1. Books
- 2. Printables/worksheets to reiforce what we learn also helps practice writing, cutting, pasting and colouring skills (pencil control and fine motor skills).
- 3. Crafts retaled to the books read.

Science, Math and Art: Lifecycle of a Butterfly

Questions will we address in this topic:

- What is an insect? (a small animal that has six legs and generally one or two pairs of wings)
- What is a butterfly? (An insect)
- Where does it come from? (Egg)
- Understand the different lifecycle stages of a butterfly
- Differentiate between Moth and Butterfly
- · Talk about Allah mentioning insects in the Qur'an

2) Printables:

The printables cover quite a bit of math and provide learning materials like 3 part cards of the lifecycle of butterfly, skip counting puzzles, graphing and so much more. Therefore, I do not do math separately (yet), and just reinforce what is in the printables. I did not print the entire packs, only the pages that were applicable to my child's level.

Islamic studies:

I covered 4 components in Islamic studies.

- 1. Name of Allah covering one name of Allah per month mostly through crafts.
- 2. Prophet of Allah covering the story of one Prophet per month including memorizing a dua that is special to them, followed by crafts
- 3. Akhlaq of the Month
- 4. Islamic Month

1) Name of Allah

- I. This month we talked about the name of Allah *Al Musawir the Shaper* as it ties in well with the butterfly unit theme. Make the children listen to the ayah and repeat the name of Allah
- II. <u>Book:</u> Qur'an Ayah (59:24) He is Allah: the Creator, the Inventor, the Shaper. He alone has the Most Beautiful Names. Whatever is in the heavens and the earth constantly glorifies Him. He is the Almighty, All-Wise.
- **III.** <u>Craft:</u> Draw the outline of a butterfly on a piece of paper. Let the kids paint on one side of the butterfly. Fold the butterfly in half when the paint is wet so the paint can print on the other side, making a symmetry. Write the arabic name Al-Musawir.

2) Prophet of Allah

I. Book: Migo and Ali

- II. We covered Prophet Musa this month as it ties well with the Islamic month that we will be covering, which is Muharram.
- III. <u>Dua:</u> Rabbish Rah Lee sadree. (Surah Taha 20:25-28) Explain you can read this dua before beginning to learn something new or when you find something difficult to do.

IV. Crafts:

- i. Basket weaving with card stock. You can watch the tutorial here
- ii. Dua Card (Rabbi Shrah li sadree) print out the dua from google images, let the kids paste it on a colourful cardstock, decorate and display.

3) Akhlaq of the Month

Intro: What is Akhlaaq and what does it mean? Why is it important?

4) Islamic Month: Muharram

- I. Explain the concept of Migration and how Prophet SAWS migrated from Makkah to Madinah
- II. To explain the concept of migration, explain how geese and monarchs have migrated to South this month because it is too cold here Prophet SAWS migrated because the Makkans were not letting the muslims practice Islam.
- III. The day when the Bani Israel were saved from Pharoh (incident of Parting of the sea) was the 10th of Muharram, also known as Ashoora. We fast this day (and a day before or after) it is a way of thanking Allah.

History and Geography

- Country: Egypt (goes with Prophet Musa theme)
- Talk about where Egypt is on the map, show them the map and flag.
- 2 things special to Egypt are Pyramids and River Nile (in which baby Musa AS was placed)
- Egypt was ruled by kings in the olden days called Pharaohs.
- **<u>Craft:</u>** Egyptian jewellry (bracelet and necklace)
 - For the necklace, take a piece of cardstock and cut it out in the shape of a thick necklace. Cut out different shapes from a glitter sheet, or construction paper and give it to the children to stick. Add a piece of yarn or string at the edges to make a necklace.
 - For the bracelets, take 2 pieces of emptied toilet paper rolls, and cut it through one side to make it like a cuff. Now get creative! You can use washi tape, stickers, stamps, left over pieces of construction paper or glitter paper to decorate your bracelets.
